69th UFI Congress Overview

UFI Congress in Munich Examines Industry Status

On October 24 and 25, 2002, the 69th UFI Congress, graciously hosted by UFI Member Messe München

GmbH, brought together 287 of the world's leaders in the trade fairs and exhibition industry. During the annual two day event, UFI provided a forum for industry leaders from 51 nations to evaluate the current state of trade fairs and exhibitions around the world, predict the trends of the future and identify the strategic options facing the industry.

Based on a multiplier analysis, Dr. Hermann Kresse, AUMA CEO, provided statistics showing that the economic impact of the trade fair industry in Germany in 2001 had production effects of 23 billion euros and employment effects impacting the equivalent of 250,000 full-time jobs. Doug Ducate, President & CEO of the North American based Center for Exhibition Industry Research (CEIR) stated that US trade fairs represent a 60\$billion industry employing an estimated 750,000



persons. Michael Duck, Vice President of CMP Asia Ltd., presenting an industry overview of the Asian market, stated that in 2001 Greater China and Asia (less Japan/Australia) organized 1,159 trade fairs which generated US \$825 million in revenue. While the industry has remained relatively stable compared to other marketing media, it is clear that there are challenges to be faced in the future.

Echoing the sentiments of many UFI members, UFI President Sandy Angus stated that "the trade fair industry must move away from the limited role of selling exhibition space to that of providing programs and value-added



services aimed at providing programs and value-added services aimed at providing our clients with marketing solutions." Faced with the challenges of globalization, mixed-media competition, and the current sluggish economic climate, Prof.Dr.Klaus E. Goehrmann, UFI Vice President and Chairman of the Board of Deutsche Messe Hannover emphasized the need for the exhibition industry to provide, "value, value, value based on a tough, efficient, price-earning ratio." Doug Ducate emphasized that in today's world of electronic communications, exhibitions are the last vestige of face-to-face marketing. As relationships will always drive commerce, it is the task of the trade fair industry to make its case for trade fairs as the most cost effective option for oneon-one marketing communications.

It is with this in mind that UFI and its network of trade fair and exhibition members will be working in the months ahead to develop a sound program to promote the industry as an ideal vehicle for relationship-brokering among exhibitors, organizers and visitor clients alike. UFI members agree that it is ever more important that UFI speaks as the voice of the trade fairs and exhibition sector to promote the qualitative values of the industry at the global level.



UFI Decisions

UFI Steering Committee Creates Position of "Incoming President"

At the 69th UFI (Union of International Fairs) Congress, UFI's Annual Assembly voted on a number of measures which will enable the organization to develop its structure to meet the challenges faced by the trade fairs and exhibitions industry in the future.

As it strives to be more responsive to the needs of its members and to guarantee policy continuity, UFI members voted at their Annual General Assembly held in Munich to create the position of "Incoming President". The role of this new position is to assist UFI's President in developing and implementing an effective, on-going UFI strategy. "In a two-year presidential cycle, an "incoming president" will ensure continuity in developing and implementing an effective UFI strategy for the future. I am convinced that Ruud van Ingen is uniquely qualified to fulfill this role." said Sandy Angus, UFI President



Ruud van Ingen, (Chairman of the Board, Jaarbeurs, Utrecht) was unanimously selected by UFI's Steering Committee to take on this role for 2002-2003. He will second Sandy Angus (Chairman, Montgomery Exhibitions, London) who continues his current mandate as UFI President until 2003.

The two will work closely with the UFI Executive Committee, UFI Business Management Committee and UFI Managing Director Vincent Gérard, to develop a UFI strategy aimed at positioning the organization for the many challenges the industry faces in the years ahead.

Venues for UFI Events Announced



UFI announced a number of events planned for the future including the 2003 UFI Congress which will be held in Cairo from 19 to 21 October and the 2004 UFI Congress which will be held in Bangkok from 24 to 26 November.

UFI also announced that it will continue it's partnership with XM as it plans for a UFI-XM Summer Seminar in Gothenburg, Sweden from 12 to 13 June, 2003. A one-day seminar on Waste Management will immediately precede the Gothenburg Summer Seminar event. Building on the success of their partnership in Singapore in 2002, UFI and XM plan to organize another Asia Seminar in mid-May 2003, the location of which will be announced shortly.

UFI Election Results

UFI Assembly Votes for New Members/Events

During the Annual General Assembly, UFI Members voted to admit a number of new members into the organization including: eleven new member organizations, two new associations, and one additional hall owner. For the first time UFI members voted for the admission of two industry partners into the organization, reflecting the strong UFI membership desire that the organization become truly representative of the entire trade fair and exhibition sector.

UFI members recognized the quality standards of 29 trade fairs and exhibitions by voting to include them as "UFI qualified" events. This internationally recognized certification was bestowed upon events covering themes as varied as coal mining and toys, in locations as widespread as Shenzhen China and Katowice, Poland. Bringing the total of UFI recognized events to 640 in 73 countries, the admission of these exhibitions reflects UFI's commitment to the development of strong international standards throughout the trade fair industry. The UFI "label" ensures that exhibitors and visitors alike will profit from the opportunities trade fairs and exhibitions provide to demonstrate products and services as they build solid marketing relationships in a sound professional environment.

UFI Meeting News

UFI Africa Chapter Meeting

The UFI Africa Chapter met in Munich on October 25, 2002 to review past activities and prepare programs for the future.

After reviewing the results of the Tunis Seminar the group agreed that similar programs should be organized in the future.

Hisham El Haddad provided information on the All Africa Fair which was held in Cairo. The African Union has asked that the UFI Africa Chapter assist with its professional expertise in the organization of future similar events. Committee members agreed that this should be pursued in the future.

Committee President El Haddad briefed the group on the Tripoli conference held with African Economic Ministers. UFI Africa provided a worksheet at this meeting which described how the fairs and exhibition industry in Africa could be developed and promoted. The group reviewed possibilities to interest foreign investors in trade fair opportunities. The Committee will strive to develop increased cooperation with the African Union in the future.

The Committee unanimously re-elected Hisham El Haddad as UFI Africa Chairman for another term.

UFI Exhibition Halls & Fairgrounds Committee Meeting

The Committee met in Lisbon on October 11, 2002 at the kind invitation of AIP/FIL.

After three years of service, Committee Chairman Fernando Caldeira Santos confirmed his decision to leave this position. UFI Managing Director Vincent Gérard and Committee members thanked his for his generous years of service.

Annette Slotty (Messe München) was appointed as the new Chairman and Juan Carlos Gomez (IFEMA Madrid) Vice Chairman of the Exhibition Halls & Fairgrounds Committee respectively with two-year mandates.

Fernando Caldeira Santos, assisted by Augusto Luzia, made an interesting presentation of the FIL waste management situation. A comparative model prepared by FIL will be distributed to all participants in the April 2002 waste management survey so that they can evaluate their results.

The group reviewed the outcome of a joint UFI/EMECA meeting on waste management held in Lisbon prior to the UFI Committee's session. This joint working group is studying the possibility to edit guidelines in order to establish standards and harmonize waste management techniques at fairgrounds. It was also agreed that the results of the UFI survey will be made available to the EMECA General Assembly in Rimini on 28 November. UFI will also prepare a summary of five waste management case studies for presentation at the Rimini meeting.

The Committee confirmed its intention to organize a one-day waste management seminar integrated with the UFI-XM Seminar in Gothenburg in June 2003. During this seminar waste management issues will be examined from both a technical and marketing perspective.

The Committee has agreed that meeting minutes will be placed in the member's section of the UFI website. The next meeting of the Committee will take place in Gothenburg on February 7, 2003.

AUMA has published its first Trade Fair Guide Worldwide listing 3,200 trade fairs in a compact DIN A5 format. The reference book in English covers fairs half of which are outside Europe. The guide may be purchased from AUMA directly.

CENTREX Central East European International Exhibition Statistics Union has launched a new workshop program focusing on international trends in building industry trade fairs. The first workshop was held in Budapest and drew participants from 12 countries.

Karen Taylor has been appointed Managing Director of **Reed Exhibitions UK.**

The International Academy of Exhibition Management, a project sponsored by Fondazione Fiera Milano has announced its launch programs for the 2002-2003 academic year. The Academy will offer a master's degree in exhibition marketing and management as well as a school for specialized exhibition staff and courses to teach companies how to maximize the benefits of their trade show participation.
